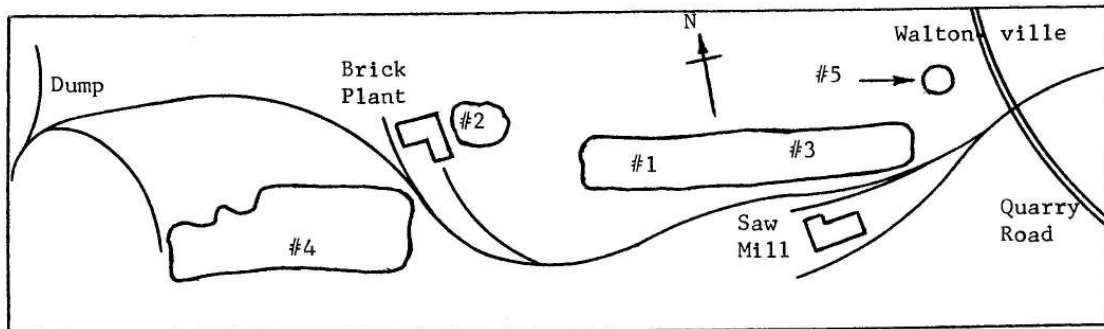


## APPENDIX C

## DIAGRAM OF QUARRIES



Quarry Road is known by that designation in the borough of Hummelstown while being called Waltonville Road after it crosses the South Mountain into the old area of Waltonville. Quarry #1 was the first one opened by the Berst Family and it was later joined with quarry #3. These quarries yielded a purplish hued brownstone that was quite hard. Quarry #2 produced a brownstone with noticeable rosy or pink hues. Quarry #4 was by far the largest and produced a deep, rich chocolate brown stone that was very popular at the turn of the century. Quarry #5 had a bluish tinted brownstone that was so hard that it was seldom used. As the smallest and least significant of the pits, this hole has been obliterated by residential development in the area.

The single line represents railroad track of the Brownstone – Middletown Railroad Company that serviced the quarries and brick plant. From the quarries this line traveled east and then headed north through a natural gap in the South Mountain called Bullfrog Valley.
